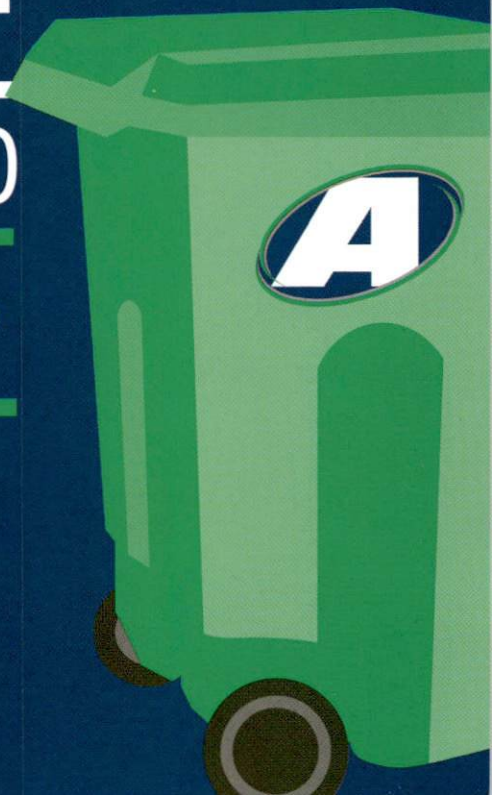

CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES

1

YOU DON'T NEED TO SEPARATE MATERIALS.

Recyclables may be mixed together inside the cart.

2

PLACE YOUR CART CURBSIDE

the night before, or no later than 6 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection.

3

PLACE YOUR CART WITHIN THREE (3) FEET OF THE CURB.

4

DO NOT PLACE ANY RECYCLABLE MATERIAL OUTSIDE OF THE CART.

It will not be collected, i.e. on top, next to cart. All materials need to be inside the cart to be collected.



- Do not place recyclable material in plastic bags. Please leave materials loose inside the cart.
- Items should be clean and dry.

NOT ACCEPTED



- Motor oil, insecticide, herbicide or hazardous chemical containers
- Plastic bags – instead reuse or return to grocery or department stores
- Plastic sheets or film (no plastic sheets, tarps or wrap)
- Window glass, auto glass, dinnerware or ceramics
- Building Materials
- Food
- Diapers
- Filters
- Electronic Waste
- Toys
- Hoses
- Wet Items

ACCEPTED



CONTAINERS



- Aluminum cans, trays and foil (trays and foil must be cleaned)
- Steel cans and tins
- Aseptic packaging and gable-top containers (milk and juice cartons)
- Glass bottles and jars (clear, brown, green)
- PET soda, water and flavored beverage bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)
- HDPE milk, water and juice jugs (#2 clear plastic resin)
- HDPE detergent and fabric softener containers (#2 colored plastic resin)
- PVC narrow neck containers only, such as health and beauty aid products, household cleaners (#3 plastic resin)
- LDPE grocery containers, such as margarine tubs, frozen dessert cups, six pack rings, etc. (#4 plastic resin)
- PP grocery containers, such as yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles (#5 plastic resin)
- #7 plastic resin narrow neck containers only
- Plastic buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5-gallon size maximum) - no metal handles

PAPER FIBER



- Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)
- Cardboard (no waxed cardboard), all corrugated cardboard cut into pieces no larger than 3' x 3'
- Kraft (brown paper) bags
- Magazines, catalogs and telephone books
- Office, computer, notebook and gift wrap paper (no metal clips, spirals, binders)
- Chipboard (cereal, cake and food mix boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)
- Carrier stock (soda and beer can carrying cases)
- Junk mail and envelopes (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)
- Paperback books (no hardcover books)
